

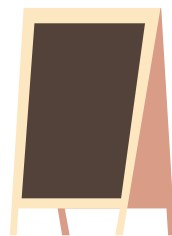
On My Block: Care for the people in your neighborhood

Make time to help others.

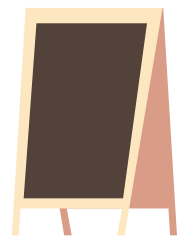
